

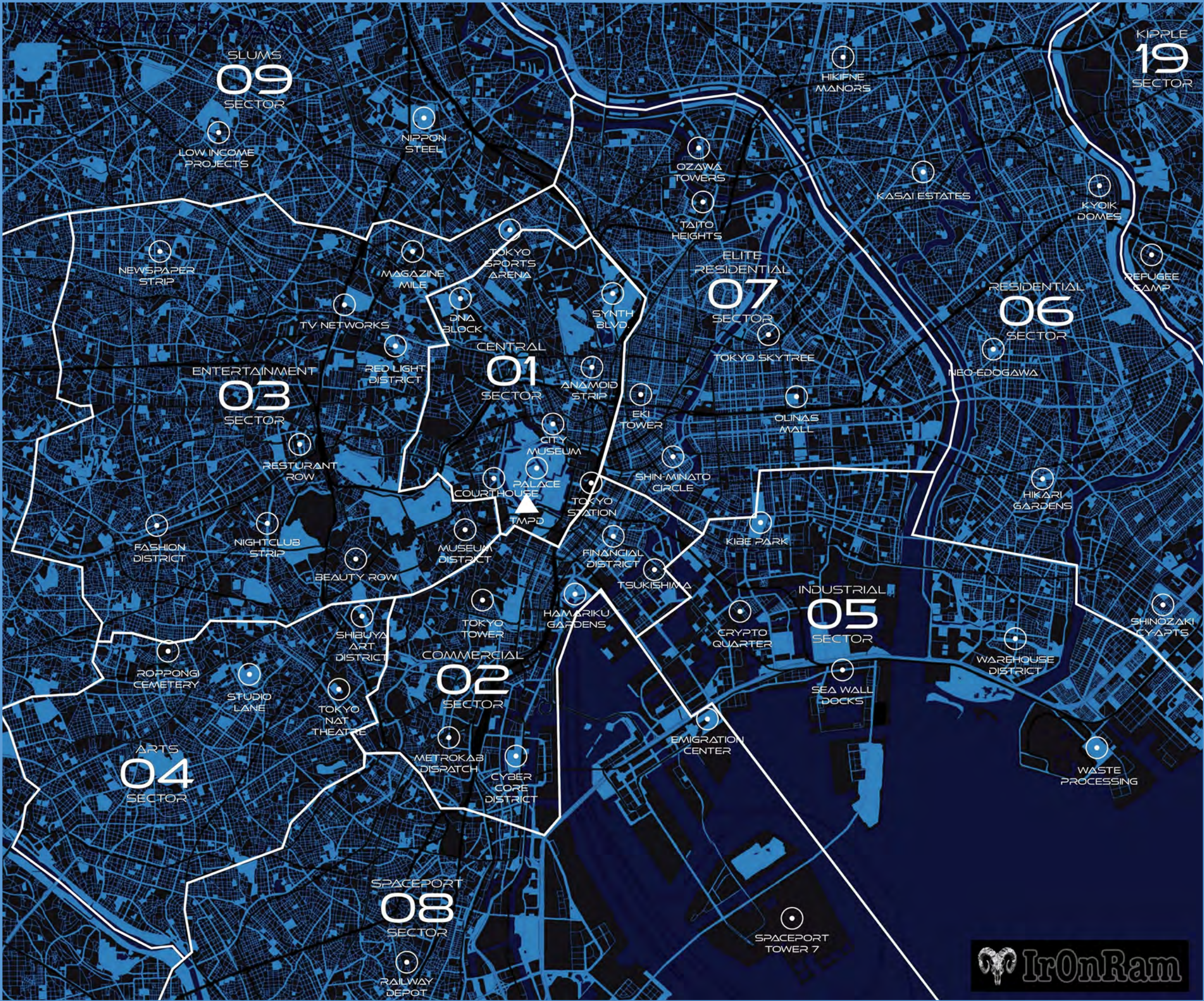


BLADERUNNER ***TOKYO 2037*** **SECTOR IV MAPS**

Financial District

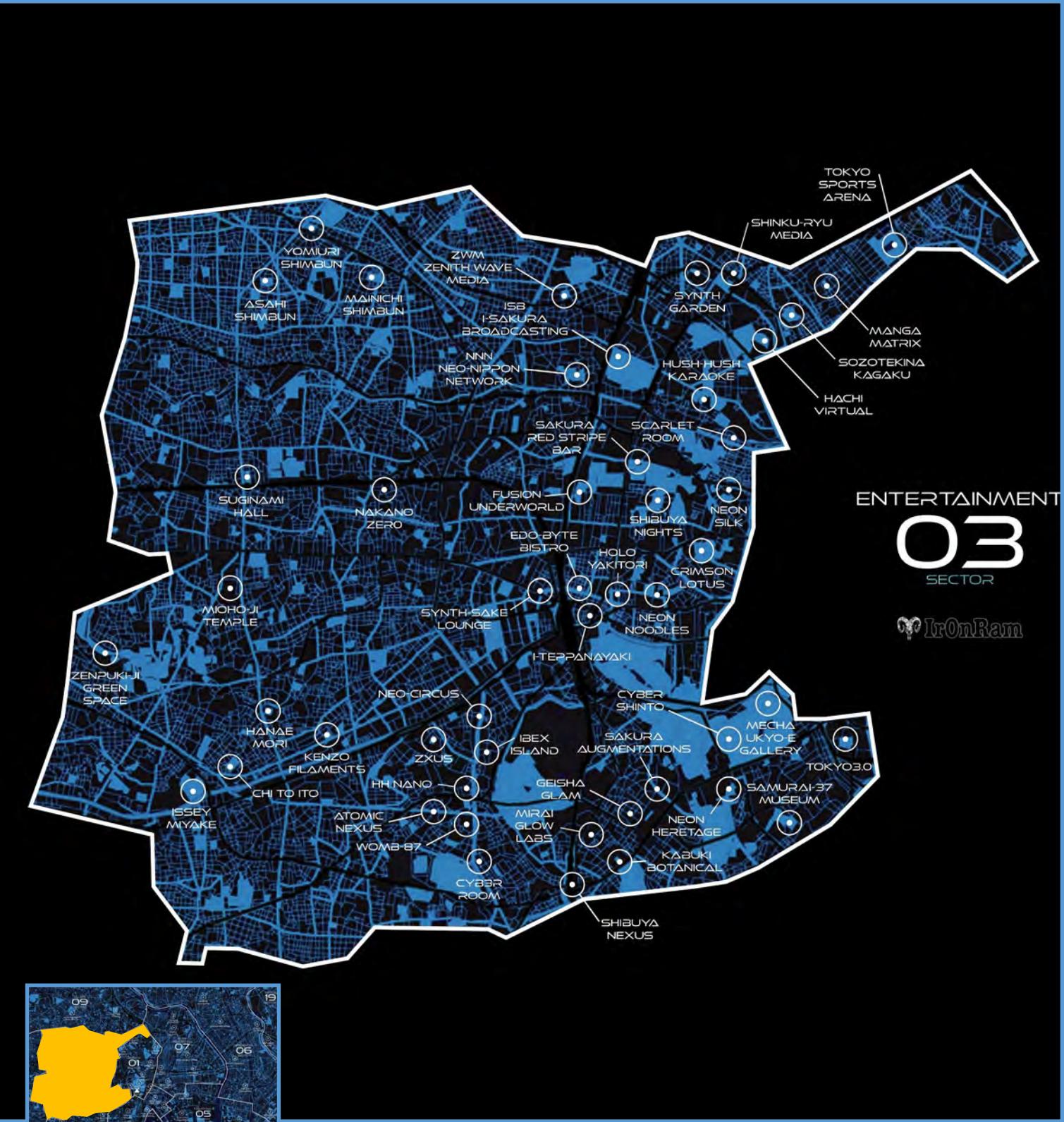

Here, residents eke out an existence in extreme poverty, their lives a stark contrast to the high-tech affluence that defines the city's core, with streets shrouded in perpetual dusk and littered with the remnants of obsolete technologies.

Nippon Steel - Once a thriving hub of industry, Nippon Steel now stands as a decrepit steel mill on the outskirts of Tokyo, its skeletal structures rusting under the acid rain that frequents the district. It employs low-income workers at a fraction of the standard wage, forcing them into grueling shifts amid hazardous conditions, where the only glow comes from molten metal and the faint hope of surviving another day in the underbelly of a cyberpunk dystopia.

Tokyo Black Market Exchange - Nestled deep within the maze-like alleyways of Tokyo's slums, the Tokyo Black Market Exchange thrives under the flicker of neon lights, offering everything from contraband cybernetics to rare, unregulated nano-drugs. Here, secrecy is currency, and transactions are guarded by masked brokers who ensure anonymity and security in a world where both are scarce.

Neo-Energy Hostels - In the shadowy recesses of Tokyo's poorest districts, Neo-Energy Hostels offer a grim bargain: humans become live batteries, renting out their bodies to power the grid in exchange for meager credits. This desperate trade occurs in dingy cells, where rows of individuals lie connected to energy-siphoning devices, their life force fueling the city's insatiable demand for power.

Shimizu Water Reclaimers - Shimizu Water Reclaimers operates from a ramshackle building in Tokyo's slums, where engineers and local volunteers work tirelessly to convert filthy runoff into potable water using jury-rigged filtration systems. Amidst constant threats of sabotage from water monopolies, this hub stands as a beacon of hope, symbolizing the struggle for survival and autonomy in a city that val-

Undergrid Cybernetics - Undergrid Cybernetics, hidden beneath Tokyo's dilapidated towers, serves the uninsured and the desperate, providing makeshift cybernetic repairs and illegal enhancements. The clinic, draped in shadows and secrecy, hums with the activity of rogue techs who operate on the fringes of legality, offering new limbs and hacked software to those willing to brave the risks for a chance at enhanced life.

Recycle Yokocho - Recycle Yokocho, a sprawling market located in an abandoned sector of the city, buzzes with the energy of scavengers and traders dealing in salvaged goods. Amidst the clutter of repurposed tech and worn-out fabrics, residents of the slums barter fiercely for necessities, transforming the discarded remnants of a consumerist society into tools of survival and small treasures.
